### Winter Driving Tips

Every vehicle handles differently, this is particularly true when driving on wet icy, and snowy roads. Take time to learn how to best handle your car under winter weather driving conditions.

- Drive slowly. It's harder to control or stop your car on a slick or snow-covered surface. On the road, sufficiently increase your following distance so you will have plenty of time to stop for vehicles ahead of you.
- A word of caution about braking: know what kind of brakes your vehicle has and how to use them properly. If you have anti-lock brakes, apply firm pressure, if you have non anti-lock brakes, pump the brakes gently.
- If you find yourself in a skid, stay calm and ease your foot off the gas while carefully steering in the direction you want the front of your vehicle to go. This procedure, known as "steering into the skid", will bring the back end of your car in line with the front.
